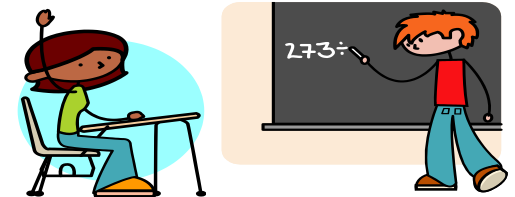

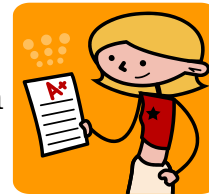


CASASTART

Striving Together to Achieve Rewarding Tomorrows, is a community school-centered prevention program developed by Columbia University. It is aimed at children in grades 5 through 7, their families, and the neighborhoods in which they live. Funded through the Department of Human Services, **CASASTART** aims to bring together key stakeholders in community schools, law enforcement agencies, social service agencies, and uses intensive case management to work with youth.

CASASTART GOALS for participating youth:

- ◆ Improve school performance and attendance.
- ◆ Prevent delinquency
- ◆ Prevent substance abuse
- ◆ Develop positive relationships between service agencies, schools, the community and families to meet the needs of the youth.
